Duties and Responsibilities

- Move patients throughout the facility in accordance with hospital procedures and protocols.
- Monitor the well-being of the patient during transfer.
- Monitor IV and oxygen delivery equipment during transfer.
- Follow facility chain of command if a patient requires intervention during a transfer.
- Use appropriate communication channels for collaborating with the care team.
- Provide efficient and clear communication to the care team regarding details of the transfer.
- Ensure patients are comfortable during the transfer and provide appropriate verbal guidance and reassurance.
- Interact with patients in a professional manner at all times and respond appropriately to a diverse range of patient behaviors.
- Deliver relevant medications, charts, belongings, or medical equipment to appropriate destinations.
- Transfer equipment, lab specimens, medications, or other items throughout the hospital.
- Transfer deceased patients to the facility morgue.
- Operate transportation equipment (wheelchairs, lifts, carts, stretchers, beds) safely and in accordance with hospital protocols.
- Report damaged equipment.
- Comply with PPE and infection control procedures.
- Follow patient confidentiality standards.
- Interact with all patients and visitors with excellent customer service skills.
